Three defending champions seek more

Any discussion of the GHSA girls basketball playoffs must begin with discussion of the defending champions. Norcross is seeking a third straight title while Wesleyan and Buford are both chasing a fourth straight crown. Wesleyan has won the past three Class A titles as well as the 2008 Class AA title, so technically another title this year would make five in a row. Buford has won every Class AA title since Wesleyan dropped down in classification, and Andraya Carter and Kaela Davis have Gene Durden's squad in position for another title chase.

GOLDEN STREAK ...

An interesting story to keep an eye on is Washington County's repeat bid. The Golden Hawks went undefeated one year ago, and two victories so far have moved Washington County's winning streak to 61 straight. Allisha Gray

is a star and will be a player to watch throughout the rest of this year and next as well.

In AAAA, Fayette County is back to quarterfinals one year after winning it all. The Tigers will face a foe capable of knocking the champs off their perch in Jonesboro. Chamblee had to go on the road in the second round after some trouble in the region tournament, as did Southwest DeKalb, but both made it to the quarterfinals following road victories. As a No. 3 seed, the Panthers are the lowest seed remaining in the quarterfinals. Meanwhile, Alcovy received 27 points from Meagan Tucker and 20 points and 24 rebounds from Ashley Williams in a 71-62 win over Warner Robins.

CINDERELLA STORY ...

In Class AAA, Hephzibah is making a

Cinderella run from its No. 3 seed, having knocked off Drew then Dougherty. North Hall squeaked by Carrollton in round two and will need to play better against Allatoona to advance to Macon.

Morgan County put up 87 points in the first round of the Class AA playoffs then followed up that win with a 30-point victory, making a statement that Buford's time at the top may be over. The No. 1 team in the state is fresh off of a region title and could make some waves in the postseason. Buford may be tough to knock out though as Davis (23 points in a round-one win over Kendrick followed up by another 22-point outing against North Oconee) is looking for her third straight title. She earned one with Norcross as a freshman before winning one last year with the Wolves.

In Class A, St. Francis took out Wesleyan in the region tournament and showed in round one that the win was no fluke. Nigia Greene matched Trion's point total with 24 in the Knights 86-24 opening round victory. Keyona Hayes tossed in 20 points, seven rebounds, five blocks and five steals in the round one victory. They followed that up with a 61-19 thrashing of Hancock Central. Southwest Atlanta Christian Academy knocked off No. 1 seed Gordon Lee 72-59

in round two and will face St. Francis in the quarters. Wesleyan will be tough to beat, though, as head coach Jan Azar has gone on the record saying this could be her best team yet. Jordan Frazier (21 points vs. Paideia, 25 against Bremen), Holli Wilkins, Katie Frerking and Kaelyn Causwell all contribute in the Wolves attack. The Wolves bashed Bremen 71-34 in round two.

But the state's highest classification seemingly has the biggest stars with Diamond DeShields at Norcross, Lexie Brown at North Gwinnett and Parkview's Erika Joseph. Joseph posted a double-double in Parkview's round-one 53-41 win over Duluth then registered double figures in round two. North Gwinnett's Brown and Peyton Whitted each racked up double-digit points in the 67-29 round one win over South Gwinnett. Brown followed it up with 20 to help rally North Gwinnett past Woodstock. And don't sleep on undefeated McEachern, the No. 1 team in Class AAAAA. The Indians are loaded with Score 44 members and are looking to avenge a loss in last year's state championship game. McEachern scored 93 points in a win over Westlake, notching 61 in the first half.

BOYS PREVIEW



One reigning champ down, four remain

If the first two rounds of the GHSA boys basketball playoffs are any indication, the quarterfinals will surely feature heart-stopping, edge-of-your seat action.

Fireworks were set off early and often in Class AAAAA, where the defending state champion is already gone. Norcross, which stunned Milton in the 2011 final, snagged the fourth seed out of Region 7 and had to go up against Berkmar, the Region 8 champion, in the first round. The host Patriots took care of Norcross 64-54, as Tim Rowe controlled the game with 11 points, 12 rebounds and three blocked shots.

Milton, the 2010 champion, was one of seven No. 1 seeds to advance, but the Eagles had to survive a spirited effort by Walton to win 68-62. The Eagles then shellacked highly-regarded Shiloh 72-52. M.L. King, the Region 2 champion, got bounced by fourth-seeded Lowndes 78-67.

REIGNING CHAMPS ...

A dynasty is forming in Class AAAAA, where Miller Grove is a three-time defending state champion. The Wolverines began their 2012 state tournament campaign with an 83-35 blowout of North Manchester. On Tuesday, "the Grove" dominated Loganville 74-29 to advance to the quarterfinals. The Wolverines held their visitors to just two third-quarter points as stud forward Tony Parker scored 15 points and snagged eight boards. Guard Christian Houston added 11 points and a career-high 11 assists. Parker, Houston, Tony Evans and Brandon Morris will be tough to overcome for the rest of the field.

Fellow Region 6 entrants Marist and Southwest DeKalb are also looking good. The War Eagles ousted Lithia Springs – the No. 1 seed from Region 5 – with a convincing 55-39 win in round one, then upset Rockdale County 65-50 in the second round. On the other side of the bracket, fourth-ranked

Southwest DeKalb beat Osborne 70-58, then Cedar Shoals 72-69.

Contenders in Class AAA will be hard-pressed to dethrone two-time defending champion Columbia. The Eagles are again ranked No. 1 and they have won 38 consecutive games against in-state competition dating back to last season. Point guard Tahj Shamsid-Deen averaged 12.7 points and 9.6 assists per game during the regular season. Columbia began its bid for a three-peat with an 84-67 win over Shaw, then beat Dalton 71-54.

The draw did Columbia no favors. A quarterfinals clash between the top two teams in the state according to many – Columbia and Carrollton – will take place in Dalton. The Trojans are led by Josh Barge, who is pouring in almost 20 points per game.

THREE-PEAT BID ...

Greater Atlanta Christian is back on top of the Class AA rankings as it bids for a third consecutive state championship. Point guard Collin Swinton runs the ship for the Spartans, who opened with a 64-48 win over Callaway, then routed Jefferson 72-42.

Second-ranked Vidalia, which won Region 2 for its first title of that sort since 1983, needed double overtime to get past Cook 70-64. Pacing the Indians is 5-foot-6 guard Devin Atkins.

No. 7 Buford was knocked out of the tournament by Dawson County Wednesday, as the Wolves were outpointed 42-35. The

Tigers were led by Tyler Dominy's 15 points and Gunnar Armstrong's 14.

Two of the last three state champions in Class A are the two highest-ranked remaining teams in the tournament. Whitefield Academy, which triumphed in 2009, is ranked No. 2 and kicked off its campaign by dismissing Hebron Christian 65-13, then St. Francis 72-30, as guard Kenny Gaines had 37.

Defending champion Wilkinson County crushed Gordon Lee 98-37 and then Landmark Christian 61-40. As for another favorite, North Cobb Christian suffered a surprising first-round exit. The Eagles were bounced by St. Francis in a 63-61 thriller. That derailed a potential mouth-watering round-of-16 showdown between North Cobb Christian and Whitefield Academy. Another potential all-Top 10 second-round matchup that never happened was Wilcox County versus Taylor County. Wilcox County forfeited its opener against Randolph-Clay after three-fourths of its team was suspended for disciplinary reasons.

A remarkable postseason run by Mount Pisgah Christian came to an end when Aquinas eliminated the Patriots 60-56 in the second round. Mt. Pisgah needed overtime just to qualify for the state tournament, beating Holy Innocents' in the Region 5 quarterfinals, then went on to win the region title.

GIRLS

Two-time defending champion Norcross will face undefeated Parkview in the quarterfinals as both teams enter the contest ranked in the top four of the Score Atlanta poll. Diamond DeShields of Norcross had 29 points, nine steals and six rebounds in round one, then had 22 in a win over Marietta. The Panthers moved to 30-0 on the season with a 48-16 win over North Forsyth in the second round. Erika Joseph contributed 12 points and Marissa Mandelove added 10 points in the victory. North Cobb will meet Hillgrove after the Warriors escaped a trip to Lowndes with a 57-50 win in the second round. North Cobb's Amber Reeves tossed in four 3-pointers and 18 points in the win. Meanwhile, Hillgrove center Mackenzie Ingram had 16 points, seven rebounds and five blocks for the Hawks in a 50-48 win over Stephenson. Watch out for Celina Rodrigo as well for Hillgrove. Region 7 foes North Gwinnett and Mill Creek will meet in the quarterfinals after Mill Creek edged Alpharetta 51-49 and North Gwinnett rallied to take out Woodstock 60-55. Nadiya Miller and Jasmine Carter will pace the Hawks while junior standout Lexie Brown (20 points, 11 rebounds and seven assists vs. Woodstock) and Ariel Johnson (20 points) will help power the Bulldogs.

BOYS

North Gwinnett has been to the playoffs before, but Norcross transfer Chris Bolden brought championship experience to the Bulldogs program this year. Bolden will play for Georgia Tech next season but his high-flying prowess has North Gwinnett thinking about a deep playoff run this season. The Milton Eagles are on a mission to reach a third straight championship game. Last year Milton fell to Norcross one year after winning the title. 


