

North looks to even up series

Saturday, Dec. 22, marks the 4th annual Chamber Bowl Senior All-Star Game for the North Fulton Forsyth Touchdown Club. The inaugural game took place in 2009 at Alpharetta High School and has rotated from North Fulton and Forsyth county schools hosting the annual game. Eric Douglas, Executive Director and founder of the NFFTD Club, has a vision of providing student-athletes with one last chance to play the sport they love as the top seniors from the area compete in this showcase game.

Various activities leading up to the game serve to provide these student-athletes with a true "bowl experience," start-

ing with the Meet the Team Media Day in early December and including events like the Chick-fil-A Kickoff Breakfast and the Scout Day player workout with the pros, where the All-Stars get the opportunity to be coached by former NFL players like Mike Haynes, Jessie Tuggle, Gary Downs and Buddy Curry. These pros are always eager to share their knowledge and skills with the younger generation. The experience reaches its pinnacle with the Outback Awards Banquet which has featured incredible speakers like Mike McCoy and Bill Curry and finally the Chamber Bowl game.

The game serves as an opportunity

for college coaches and scouts to evaluate some of the best talent from North Metro Atlanta. Teams are divided by region into North and South squads representing the 26 area high school programs. Games have been fun and competitive, with the South holding a 2-1 series lead. The North squad will be looking to avenge a tough 49-0 defeat to a talented South team in 2011 and for its first win since that inaugural game, when the North won by a score of 29-7.

The Chamber Bowl is the exclamation point to another incredible year of honoring the players and coaches of the North Fulton Forsyth Touchdown Club. Each month during the season the NFF-TD Club recognizes Offensive and Defensive Players of the Week as nominated by each team's head coach. Throughout the year, speakers from the likes of Dan Reeves and Vince Dooley to Rich McKay have challenged and encouraged the players, coaches and fans attending the monthly dinners.

The events of the NFFTD Club help to serve as means of carrying out the Mission to: "RECOGNIZE and PROMOTE the game of FOOTBALL, its COACHES, PLAYERS and SUPPORTERS for their accomplishments, on and off the field of competition. SOUTH SQUAD

South roster features nice balance

For a number of seniors in the North Fulton and Forsyth County area, the football season is not over quite yet. They will get a chance to showcase their talents in the Dec. 22 Chamber Bowl, an annual All-Star Game that will be held this year at Lambert High School in Suwanee.

In a battle between North and South teams, the South squad is made up of players from 11 different high schools. Leading the way are Chattahoochee and Roswell, which have 11 representatives apiece on the South roster—also more than any other school on the North side.

Roswell finished a disappointing 3-7 as part of a tough Region 5-AAAAAA, but three of their losses came by three points or fewer. Only one of their seven setbacks came by more than 14 points. Offensive skill players for Roswell who will take part this weekend include quarterback Ryan

Monty, running back Andrew Kwateng and wide receiver Bennett Barton. Monty completed 101 of 154 passes for 1,585 yards and 12 touchdowns with only two interceptions. Kwateng rushed for 1,458 yards and 10 touchdowns, while Barton hauled in 42 passes for 742 yards and seven scores. Linebacker Grant Beidel, who should be a factor at linebacker in the Chamber Bowl, led the team with 100 tackles, three interceptions and four sacks. Also looking to wrap up his high school football campaign on a high note is defensive back Alex Brandeis, who also snagged a team-high three interceptions to go along with 82 tackles.

Chattahoochee went 7-3 in the regular season before falling to Norcross in the first round of the Class AAAAA playoffs. Myles Hill, who starred for the Cougars at both wide receiver and safety, was named North Fulton Forsyth Touch-

down Club Defensive Player of the Week in early November after his performance in a 48-14 win over Lambert. Offensive lineman Brandon Keith is Chattahoochee's only offensive player in the Chamber Bowl who was named to an All-Region Team in 6-AAAAAA. Defensive end Majeed Bilal and safety Josh Hearn are first-team All-Region performers that the South squad will be happy to utilize.

The final playoff spot out of that region all came down to Chattahoochee and Centennial, which has 10 players on the South roster. The Knights fell 33-20 to end their season, but that won't be the last time quarterback Chase Rosenberg sees the field in high school. One of four quarterbacks for the South, Rosenberg threw for 2,296 yards and 18 touchdowns. Three of Centennial's defensive standouts will also be back in action. Defensive end Lorenzo Mc-Williams had seven sacks while defensive backs Kola Balogun and Cory Grimes both picked off three passes.

Two more quarterbacks on the roster are Blessed Trinity's Spencer McManes and Holy Spirit Prep's Sean O'Connell. McManes accounted for 18 total touchdowns (five on the ground) while pacing the Titans to a 9-3 record. O'Connell played both ways at Holy Spirit, also featuring prominently on defense at safety.

Among the other players to watch on

the South side is North Springs' Xavier Landers, who can line up at both tight end and wide receiver. Landers played football his freshman year, but then sat out two seasons to focus on ROTC training before returning to the gridiron as a senior. The Spartans have not won a non-forfeited game since 2008, but their biggest offensive weapon will have a chance to go out in victorious fashion on Saturday.

Also keep an eye on the Riverwood Raiders, who boast 10 players on the South roster. Three were named to the All-Region Team in 7B-AAAAA: offensive tackle Zach Kilgore, wideout Jonathan Goodson and defensive end William Holiday. At Holy Innocents', running back Stephen Williams knows a thing or two about following the blocks provided by center Grant Gosden. They will team up one more time on Saturday.

Thirteen coaches, at least one from each of the schools with player representatives, will lead the South squad on Saturday. Head coaches on the South roster are Terry Crowder of Chattahoochee, Ryan Livezey of Holy Innocents', Doug Dixon of Mount Pisgah Christian, Hunter Chadwick of Fellowship Christian and Jeff Carlberg of Centennial.

NORTH SQUAD

Skill position players highlight North

Players from 12 different North Fulton and Forsyth County schools/teams will make up the North squad for this year's Chamber Bowl. Lambert's Sid Maxwell will coach the North team with a staff consisting of coaches from North Forsyth, Pinecrest, South Forsyth, Johns Creek, North Georgia, Forsyth Central, St. Francis, Milton and King's Ridge. The North team on paper appears extremely athletic with countless players capable of making plays at multiple positions.

Maxwell's son Brock will be an option under center as will Johns Creek quarter-back Skye Overton. Maxwell was a threat with his legs probably moreso than his arm this season for Lambert. Earlier this year against Roswell, Maxwell carried the ball 21 times for 105 yards and he toasted South

Forsyth for three scores on the ground. This will likely be his last time on the gridiron as he will play baseball for South Carolina at the next level.

Overton can also burn you with his legs as he scored 11 touchdowns on the ground this season. He also finished with more than 1,300 yards passing and nearly 900 yards rushing.

South Forsyth's Jantzen Jeffrey is a dualthreat quarterback who has battled through injuries since October. The Air Force Academy likes Jeffrey's athleticism and has offered the 6-foot, 205-pound athlete.

Other multipurpose quarterbacks on the roster include North Georgia Falcons QB/WR/RB Mike Randle and North Forsyth QB/RB/WR Justin Stanley. Sid Maxwell could use these backs on trick plays. Teams must always be wary of Northview running back Terrence Upshaw. The 5-foot-10 back holds offers from Buffalo and Vanderbilt and was explosive throughout the season. He surpassed the 1,000-yard mark late in the year and was a threat to take any play to the house from anywhere on the field. He had 11 touchdowns of at least 40 yards this year. He finished with 27 rushing scores and has also scored on punt returns and kick returns this season.

Upshaw will be joined in the backfield by Lambert running back Daniel Myers, fullback Trevor T.J. Denny of North Georgia and fullback Garrett Bode of St. Francis.

Some of the X-factors to watch out for include Lambert's Chandler Register, a wingback/wide receiver, and South Forsyth's Jordan Arnett, a receiver possessing the ability to break a game wide open. Arnett hauled in three scores in a game earlier this year against Forsyth Central and he can run after the catch as he did against Lambert for a 55-yard score.

The offensive line will feature several big bodies that helped their teams advance to the postseason. Johns Creek center Sam Arrington and West Forsyth guard Will Bass and tackle Zach Bradbury will join Milton's Connor Harp along the offensive line. Other linemen to watch out for include North Forsyth's Colby Gossett, Northview's Rohil Prathap and King's Ridge Christian's William Reagan.

Defensively, Johns Creek sends a pair of linebackers to the North roster in Tommy Welch and Zachary Disher. Those two will be joined by West Forsyth's Josh Salo and Lambert's Russell Monyette, among others.


Up front on the defensive line, Forsyth Central's Ruben Rubio leads the charge. The 6-foot-1, 310-pound senior nose guard will offer plenty of push from the interior of the line.

In the secondary, Josh Gordon of West Forsyth joins Johns Creek's Will Somers and South Forsyth's Zach Laflamme.

Finally, Maxwell should know that he will have three points in the bank with Johns Creek kicker Kyle Fowler on his roster. The Gladiators kicker split a 52-yard attempt through the uprights earlier this year against Rome and then proved to have ice water in his veins by nailing a game-tying field goal with just seconds left against Chattahoochee.
